Hi Axel,

I did not receive something like what you mentioned, but in April this year an email was forwarded to me whereby this company had sent an invoice to the University asking for a participation fee, a publication fee and a late fee (totalling around \$7,000 euros). None of those fees were disclosed to us or invoiced earlier, so after consultation with our Faculty we basically communicated to them that we will not be paying these and that they can unpublish the video. They did send me an email trying to persuade me to pay because "it is bad for your career" so it seems to be some sort of extortion.

What I recommend is getting in touch with your University's legal department for advice, but in general these charges were not disclosed in communication with us which seems to be the basis for these being fraudulent (in my case I remember receiving an invitation from them to take part which did not include any information about fees). It might of course be different for a European organization since they are based in Europe.



Said conference was given by you and recorded and published by my client with his approval at his request on his YouTube channel.

Our client informs us that despite the fact that the service was provided to his entire satisfaction and without any reproach, to date he has not proceeded to pay the agreed amount as fees. Numerous requirements were sent to you without you deigning to attend to the aforementioned payment, which is why you were notified of the start of an arbitration procedure in accordance with the provisions of the merited contract and the Warsaw Pan-European Arbitration Court proceeded to dictate the corresponding award in our possession.

It is the custom of this office to try to resolve all kinds of disputes out of court and it is for this reason that we send you this friendly request for payment.
